## ACCIDENTS ARE UNPREDICTABLE...

Knowing what to do at the scene can make all the difference in protecting your rights and building a solid case.

Once you make sure you're physically and emotionally safe at the crash scene, while you're waiting for the police, start gathering evidence. Exchange information with the other driver, photograph their vehicle and license plate, and do the same for any other vehicles involved. Collect contact details from any eyewitnesses who saw the accident and are willing to testify.

Over the years we have learned that many individuals have a keen sense of integrity about issues like this, and the only problem arises when someone fails to obtain the name, telephone number, email, and current physical address for any individual who has knowledge about the crash. You should take photographs of any tracks or traces left at the accident scene, including skid marks, or other markings on the shoulder of the road that show the travel paths of vehicles or give evidence of the speeds of the vehicles involved.
